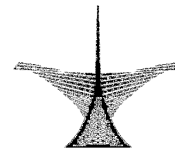

- Focus on workshop structure as well as pre-writing, revision, editing strategies, and writing assessment.
- Demonstrate writing-to-learn strategies which support student understanding without increasing teaching workload.
- Explore ways to motivate students to become better and more powerful writers.
- Demonstrate, for each other, the benefits of writing workshop and writing-to-learn strategies in order to support other teachers.

This is an INVITATIONAL INSTITUTE of the Milwaukee Writing Project in partnership with MPS and MAM.

- Have the option to earn 3-6 graduate education credits from Carroll University. A grant from the National Writing Project allows for scholarships resulting in reduced credit cost of ½ price tuition fee per credit.
- Work with your team, or individually, to develop an Action Plan to help other teachers realize the benefits of writing-to-learn and writing workshop.
